UT Prof's Work Selected

A University of Texas assistant professor of music is among five American composers whose works have been selected for performance next April in the Cleveland Orchestra's New Music Program."

Dr. Lothar Klein's "Musique a Go-Go," a one-movement piece for full orchestra, was selected by Cleveland's noted conductor George Szell.

Dr. Klein, a UT faculty member since 1962, teaches courses in music and theory and composition.

Along with other winning works chosen in the national competition sponsored by the Rockefeller Foundation, Dr. Klein's composition will be performed by the Cleveland Orchestra at Severance Hall, April 13; Oberlin College, April 14; and Kent State University, April 15.

The five composers will actively participate for a week in the "New Music Program," attending rehearsals in Cleveland, conferring with the conducting staff and helping to prepare their scores for concert performance. In addition, they will participate in symposiums and meetings with students on the campus of 10 educational institutions in the Cleveland area which are cooperating with the orchestra's project.

Purpose of the new program is to provide American composers with opportunities for professional performances of symphonic scores and to put college students in closer touch with modern composers.
