Professor's 'Musique A Go-Go' To Be Recorded by Orchestra

Dr. Lothar Klein's new orchestral work, "Musique A Go-Go," has been chosen for recording by the Louisville Symphony Orchestra.

University composer and as-

sistant professor of music, Klein will go to Louisville Monday to begin supervision of recording sessions. The symphony specializes in the performing and recording of contemporary music. Conducted by Robert Whitney, the Louisville Symphony makes recordings under the First Editions label.

"I am honored that my work has been selected," the composer said, "for the recording of serious contempory music is difficult and rarely attempted."

Klein said his "Musique A Go-Go" is a one-piece movement that requires a large orchestra. He described the composition's style as being "somewhere between Ravel and Stan Kenton."

A faculty member since 1962, Klein teaches courses in theory and composition. He has written a number of prize-winning compositions that have been performed throughout the United States and in several foreign countries.

The composer holds three degrees from the University of Minnesota and also has studied at the Free University in Berlin.
