Work Of UT Prof Recorded

The Louisville Symphony Orchestra has notified Dr. Lothar Klein, University of Texas composer and assistant professor of music, that it will record his new orchestral work, "Musique A Go-Go."

Dr. Klein is in Louisville for the week to supervise recording sessions with the well-known symphony which specializes in the performing and recording of contemporary music. Conducted by Robert Whitney, the Louisville Symphony makes recordings under the First Editions label.

Dr. Klein said that "Musique A Go-Go" is a one-movement piece that requires a large orchestra. He described the composition's style as being "somewhere between Ravel and Stan Kenton."

"I am honored that my work has been selected by the Louisville Symphony, for the recording of serious contemporary music is difficult and rarely attempted," Klein said.

The young composer, a UT faculty member since 1962, teaches courses in theory and

composition. He has written a number of prize-winning compositions which have been performed throughout the US and in several foreign countries. Dr. Klein has three degrees from the University of Minnesota and also has studied at the Free University in Berlin.
